Story of the week



Please let us know if you have any frogspawn in your garden that we could have a look at in Nursery!

This week we will also be:

- Going on a nature walk around the grounds, thinking about what plants and insects need to live and grow.

You could look around your garden or the park and see what plants and animals you can find.

- Jumping from different heights and to different lengths using simple measurements e.g. jumping from 2 crates high.

You could try some simple measuring e.g. count how many steps from the bathroom to bed.

- Sorting things by size and length.

You could sort things at home by size e.g. teddies, books or favourite toys. Use language such as; longer, shorter, taller, smaller.

Religious Education



In RE we have been thinking about 'New Life'. We have been looking at different things that grow and what we need to live.

We have also been thinking about our own experiences in Church and talking about the things we see and hear e.g. the Priest, the readings, the sign of peace, Holy Communion, candles, praying etc.

Please support us at home by taking your child to Church regularly. Talk with them about what is happening in Mass and why. This will help to keep them engaged but also to give them an understanding of what is going on.

And finally...

The weather is getting much warmer now and children enjoy playing and learning outside. Fresh drinking water is available both inside and outside and the children are regularly reminded to stop for a drink if they need one. We encourage them to pour their own drink and put their cup in the washing up bowl. Reinforcing this at home will help their understanding.

Children may wear more suitable summer uniform now. Navy blue shorts with the light blue polo shirt and jumper are the most practical thing for all of the children as we are so active all of the time.
