Bianka Varga

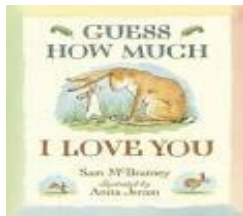


Well done, Bianka! You were our star because you helped to clear away all the toys to keep our Nursery tidy.
