This week we are learning about the wonder of God's Creation and how we need to look after all of the things that God has created.

Please talk to your child about ways in which they can care for the living things that are familiar to them, eg. plants, flowers, pets etc.

We have so many lovely activities planned for this week. Here are some ideas of ways in which you can support the children's learning at home;

Nature Walk - go on a walk through the park and encourage your child to explore nature, through their senses. Talk to your child about what they can see, hear, touch and smell.

Creative - explore hand and finger printing, collage and making leaf and bark rubbings.

Number - Sing number songs with an emphasis on ordering numbers. Call out a number and ask your child to clap or jump that many times!
