

St. Joseph's Catholic Primary School Sports Report



What is Sports Premium?

The government has provided £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/5 to provide substantial new funding for primary school sport. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health, and Culture, Media and Sport, with the money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving sport and PE for all their children. Each schools receives £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year Here at St. Joseph's we received £12,919 for 2014/15. Schools must spend the sports funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this.

At St. Joseph's we are strongly committed to PE. This is evident in the wide range of activities in and out of school that we offer, including being involved in competitive sports. We have specialist staff who are involved in delivering high quality provision. We recognise the importance of PE to the health and well-being of our children and the impact the PE curriculum and extracurricular activities can have on the attitudes, confidence and academic achievement of all children.

We have used our Sports Grant to:

- Appoint a lead practitioner to be an enthusiastic role model who encourages children to participate in regular sports activities and competitions, extends the provision on offer and works closely with the local schools to support better collaboration;
- Conduct an internal audit of current sports provision and develop a strategy for enriching it;
- Increase the participation of boys and girls in intra and inter school tournaments and competitions
- Extend support from specialist coaches into both KS1 and KS2
- Collaborate with other schools through the Barnet School Sports Partnership
- Create opportunities for gifted and talented children in sports to extend their skills at a higher level
- Extend the range of after-school and lunchtime sports activities on offer for all children, ie. lunchtime table tennis in the playground
- Train pupils as sports leaders in the school to act as role models and support the development of skills in other children
- Extend the resources available for physical activity by the installation of a MUGA (multi use games area) and Active Trim Trail and by changing the timetable so they are available both for KS1 and KS2 use.
